Overview

Health and safety professionals use their knowledge and skills to promote a positive health and safety culture in the workplace. They ensure that employees comply with safety legislation and that safety policies and practices are adopted and adhered to. Many companies are legally required to employ a Health and Safety Practitioner and the best qualified candidates are in high demand.

What's the job market like?

Health and safety professionals are in demand, putting an increased amount of pressure on already rising salary levels. This is due to a number of factors.

Throughout the pandemic when many other roles were let go or furloughed, many companies retained and indeed recruited individuals within this sector, as Health and Safety was pushed to the top of organisations agendas.

Post Covid, the economy has been recovering with high growth, record numbers of vacancies and low unemployment. This has led to further demand for individuals within the health and safety sector.

As a result of this, it has been increasingly difficult for organisations to recruit, and therefore there have been major salary increases within the sector as companies battle for talent. Currently, Heads of Health and Safety earn in the region of £70,000 to £80,000.

Each company will have an elected person in charge of the Health & Safety; large organisations may have a Health & Safety Director who manages a team to implement policy, however a small company may have a Health & Safety Consultancy that oversees safety standards.
